Humbly sheweth

That your ^{petitioner} has resided in the said Province for
more than one year - That pursuant to an
agreement with and permission of Mr. Thomas
Hornor he settled himself and family upon
the ~~lot~~ numbered four in the second concession
in Blenheim in December last - That he
has never taken up any other land in
the said Province - That he professes the Chris-
tian Religion, has lived in obedience to the
Laws, and has taken the oath of allegiance -
Your petitioner therefore prays your Honor
to grant him the said Lot No. 4. in the
Second concession in Blenheim and he
as in duty bound shall ever pray &c -
York 13th June 1797 - Edward Bean.

I do hereby certify that on the 12th Day of June 1797^{57^a}
Edward Bun of 27 years of age born in the Province
of New Hampshire in North America, Professing
the Christian Religion & by trade a Farmer
appeared before me William Kennedy Smith
One of His Majestys Justices of the Peace in and
for the Home District & took the oath of
allegiance & signed the Declaration
W. K. Smith. J.P.
