The Petition of Caleb Burdick of
 Oxford, Yeoman, in behalf of his wife
 Levinah Burdick.

Sheweth

That on the 17 July 1805. His Excellency
 Lt. Governor Hunter in Council, was pleased to
 grant 200 acres of Land to Levinah Burdick as
 the daughter of a W^d Loyalist. The fiat
 whereof is lodged in the Surveyor General's
 Office —

That your Petitioner residing in Oxford,
 on the River Thames, was desirous of locating
 his said wife's grant of 200 acres, upon Lot
 N^o. 24 in the 1st Concession of the western Division
 of that Township, formerly entered to Thomas
 Ingersoll, but since relinquished by him
 he having received his complement of Land

in other parts of the Township, whereby the
Lot N. 24 in the said 1. Concession is become
vacant, and at the disposal of your Honn.

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays
your Honn would be pleased to permit
him to locate the said N. 24 - in the name
of his wife Levinah Burdick, on the authority
before stated - and your Petitioner as
in duty bound shall ever pray -

May it please your Honor

In obedience to your Honor's order
of reference to me of the 23^d Instant to report
upon the Petition of Caleb Burdick in behalf
of his wife Levinah Burdick -

I am to state to your Honor that on the 19th of
July last, Caleb Burdick lodged in this Office
the Attorney General's fiat, founded upon
an order in Council by His late Excellency
Peter Hunter Esquire, bearing date the 17th
July in the present year, granting to the
said Levinah Burdick, 200 acres of Land
as the Daughter of a U. E. Loyalist -
