Rachel Tice Trustees and Executors and Executrix of this  
my Will - I give devise and bequeath to my said Trustees  
and Executors and Executrix ~~all~~ my Household and personal  
Estates and Effects Upon the Trusts and for the intents and  
purposes following (that is to say) Upon Trust to permit and  
suffer my Wife to reside and dwell in my dwelling house -  
during the term of her life and my two Daughters Anninda  
and Jane until they attain the age of twenty one years respectively  
And by and out of my Personal Estate and the annual  
proceeds and profits of my Real Estate to provide for and  
maintain in a proper and decent manner my said Wife and  
two Daughters and to supply them with sufficient Clothing  
and other Necessaries And Order and direct my said  
Trustees unless they shall see cause to the contrary to permit  
and suffer my son John Burgess to occupy and cultivate
