into this Province with his Parents about
21 years ago, that he has resided therein
since that time, and is now married,
that having the means to cultivate 100
acres of wild Land he is desirous to
obtain a grant of that quantity -
that he has taken the Oath of Allegiance
required by Law and has never received
any Land or order for Land from the
Crown. Wherefore he prays that your Honor
will be pleased to grant him one hundred
acres of Land subject to the payment of
Fees under the present regulations.
