Petitioners for upwards of twelve years. That on application for a Patent for the  
Lot by your Petitioners agent, finds, that an application has been made to purchase  
the lot and that an order of your Excellency in Council will be required to confirm  
the location in order that the same may be laid under the heir and Devisee  
Commission -

Wherefore your Petitioner Humbly prays an order in  
Council to that effect may issue - And as in duty bound will ever pray

The Petitioner applies that the cancelled location, Lot number twenty four on the East side of the Communication Road in the Township of Harwich made 5<sup>th</sup> May 1818 in the names of Joseph Carrolle may be restored with the view of his heir proceeding with a claim before the Heir & Heir Commission. Reference is requested to an order in Council of the 22<sup>nd</sup> October 1849 relating to the lot in question adopted when the Petition of William Smith, also to the report from this Office of the 10<sup>th</sup> September 1849. - From these it will be observed that the location existed for a period exceeding thirty one years during which taxation was exacted.

On the Petition of William Carroll, stating that his late Father, Sergeant Joseph Carroll was Located for Lot number Twenty four, East side of the Communication Road, in the Township of Harwich - that his (the Petitioner's) Eldest Brother and the Heir at Law to the Locator, is both blind and deaf, and has been supported by Petitioner for upwards of twelve years and praying that the location which has been cancelled may be restored in order that the same may be claimed under the Heir and Devise Commission.

In consideration of the unfortunate state of the Heir at Law being deaf & dumb The Committee recommended the prayer of the Petition - the Location having been allowed to exist for a period exceeding thirty one years without performance of the conditions of the same.

In consideration of the Heir at Law of the Locator being both deaf & blind the Committee recommended that the Lot prayed for be sold at 2/6 per acre to the Petitioner for the benefit of the Heir
