The Petition of Jean Baptiste Clement, late  
militia man of Captain Markham's volunteer  
Flank Company of the Militia of the Upper  
Province -

Humbly Sheweth.

That your Petitioner for his services during  
the late war, received a grant of 100 acres of land  
in the Township of Melford in the London  
district: that your Petitioner after having got the  
settlement entries performed on the same and got  
the necessary certificate to that effect, gave the same  
with the location ticket to Mr Ingraham M. P.  
who at that time was coming to York and  
whom your Petitioner authorized to take out the  
deed for the said Land. that Mr Ingraham  
apprised your Petitioner that he had lodged the  
location ticket with the certificate in the Sur-  
veyor General's office: but in consequence of  
illness he Mr Ingraham was obliged to return  
without taking out the said Deed -

That afterwards your Petitioner travelled a great  
distance on foot to York, went to the Surveyor  
General's office in order to get his Deed; but  
the Clerk in that office told him that he

Could not find the location ticket nor the certificate.  
that they were lost some where about the office. that  
Mr Ingersole being ~~since~~<sup>dead</sup>, your Petitioner is  
unable to procure an affidavit of their being  
left in the office. that your Petitioner is in  
indigent circumstances with a large family  
and without a place to settle upon unless he receives  
a deed for the said 100 acres of land -
