Know all men by these presents that I Daniel H
Cornell of the Township of South Norwich, County of
Oxford, and Province of Canada (West) Farmer, being of
Sound disposing mind and memory, do on this third
day of Sixth month in the year of our Lord one thousand
Eight hundred and fifty six make and publish this
my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
Viz; Firstly, That my Funeral charges and all my just
debts be paid. Secondly; It is my Will that my Wife
Phebe W Cornell draw from my Estate the Sum of
one thousand dollars at any time she thinks proper
(after my decease) to replace that amount which I
received from her property in time past. Thirdly; I
give and bequeath unto Maria S Wing the Sum of
Twenty five dollars. It is also my Will, that a Sum
not exceeding three hundred dollars, be placed at my
Wife Phebe W Cornell's disposal, for the benefit of
Maria S Wing, provided she (Phebe W Cornell) thinks
it necessary. Fourthly; I give and bequeath unto my
Nephew Daniel H Burnham the Sum of Fifty dollars
he being my namesake. Fifthly; I give and bequeath unto
Catherine Mee Carthy the Sum of Ten dollars. Sixthly;
It is my Will that my Wife Phebe W Cornell shall
have the sole use, benefit, profits, and disposal of all
my remaining Interests both Real and Personal, during
her natural life, and also that she Phebe W Cornell
shall have the entire disposal of one half of the residue
of all of my Property both Real and Personal at the
time of her death. The remainder of my Property both
Real and Personal to be disposed of in the following manner
Viz; To be equally divided between my Brother W Henry
Cornell and my Sisters, Amy C Burnham, Anna C Cornwall
Eliza M Cornwall and Emeline P Cornell, also my
Nephews Elisha Taylor and Jacob Taylor (sons of my Sister
Mary Taylor deceased) Edward Dopping and Henry Dopping

and my Niece Ann Eliza Austin, (Sons and daughter of
my Sister Hannah A. Lopping deceased) and my
Niece Melissa Megregory (daughter of my Sister Jane
Megregory deceased) They the within named Nephews
and Nieces to receive their Mothers portions respectively
equally divided. And should my brother Henry, or
either of my Sisters, or my Nephews or Nieces (as spoken
of in the within instrument) be removed by death ^{previous}
to the division of the within named Property, and leaving
no lawful issue, their portions shall be equally divided
among my remaining lawful Heirs.

Lastly, I constitute and appoint Phibe W. Cornell my
Wife Executrix, Gephtha W. Babcock of the Town of Somerset
County of Niagara, State of New York, and Robert B.
Cornwell of the Township of South Norwich, County of
Oxford and Province of Canada (West) my Executors
for the due fulfilment and execution of this my last
Will and Testament.
