him, the sum of two hundred Dollars of the lawful
money of this Province to be placed in the hands of
the said Joseph O'Keill in trust, by my executors
hereinafter named, he the said Joseph O'Keill to
pay over to the said Francis O'Keill when he shall
arrive at the age of twenty one years the sum above
named.

I give and devise all the rest and residue of my
property of which I may die possessed to to my
beloved Sister Mary Hill, formerly the wife of
John Hill, said Mary Hill being supposed to

be a resident of Genesee County state of
New York, U.S.

And I do nominate Chauncy Ferguson
and William McDonald of Lillieburgh,
Township of Derekham, County of Oxford, and Province
of Canada as executors of this my last Will
and Testament,
