The Petition of John Bron of Blenheim, Governor,
County Shrewsbury.

That James Bron late of Augusta
in the District of Shrewsbury, deceased,
was granted 200 Acres of Lands under
Order in Council 8th November 1797. dying
soon after he did not locate the said order
and it still remains so.

That your Petitioner is the eldest
surviving Son of the said James Bron who
did intestate - That your Petitioner understands
that there are in the Township of Terra, which
is the Township meant to your Petitioner in
which locations are made, Lands vacant
from the non performance of the Settlement
duty. - He therefore humbly prays Your
Excellency may be pleased to permit him to
locate the aforesaid grant in the said Township
of Terra to which end that the Surveyor Genl:
do furnish your Petitioner with a list of the
Lands vacant as aforesaid, in order to him
claiming the same under the Heir & Devise Act,
And as in duty bound
