The Petition of John Coon of Blenheim

200 Acres of Land under order in Council  
8<sup>th</sup> November 1797 which was never  
located - That the North half of Lot No. 5 of the  
twelfth Consp<sup>o</sup> and the South half  
of Lot No. 10 of the thirteenth Consp<sup>o</sup>  
both in the Township of Mars are vacant  
and grantable Land.

He therefore humbly prays your  
Excellency may be pleased to permit him  
to locate the above Lands in the name of  
his late Father in order to claim the  
same under the Heir and Devisee Act  
and as in duty bound
