James Edmund Dea

25 March 1844

and Probate granted  
to Wm. Fuller -

In the Name of God The Father, Son and Holy Ghost  
One God over all Blessings for ever, Amen -

I James Edmund Dea. of the Township of Nepouin -  
being at this present time infirm in body, but through the  
Mercy of God, of Sound and disposing Mind - do make and  
declare this my last will and Testament - Having signed  
the same with my own hand in presence of three subscribing  
witnesses.

In the first place, <sup>in my will</sup> that my Son in Law William Tuckey, shall take  
care to have my mortal remains decently interred in the burial  
ground in Trapatzen in which his wife's remains are laid -

2<sup>d</sup>. Whereas during my life time I have made a fair provision for my  
two elder daughters - Eliza wife of William Mills and Sarah  
wife of Benjamin Nowden. which I have given them on their  
marriage. I now bequeath them each the sum of five shillings  
which my executor (after named) shall pay them within  
one year after my decease -

3<sup>d</sup>. Whereas I have a sum of money amount - Eighteen pounds ten  
shillings now by me - my will is that said sum be lodged in the  
hands of the Rev. John Pothua for the sole benefit of my daughter  
Caroline Dea. to be paid her on her marriage along with any  
interest which may be received from it -

4. Whereas Messrs. Austin & P. St. Wilmett hold a note payable to me  
by Mr. Francis Boush for Twenty five pounds, <sup>due Jan<sup>y</sup>. 1847</sup> my will is that  
when said note shall be collected the amount shall be lodged

in the hands of the Rev John W. Thull. for the benefit of my  
daughters Mary Dea - and of my Grandson. Edmond Turkey  
in equal parts. to be paid them upon their respective, coming  
of age or being married -

Further. I will and bequeath to my Son in Law William Turkey  
one yoke of oxen. two cows. a clock and all my wearing apparel  
& half of my household furniture -

I will and bequeath to my daughter Carolin in addition to the  
sum of money already in this writing will be to her. My silver watch  
the white face ruff and the remaining half of the household furniture  
& also will that whatever amount of provision may be due me at the  
time of my decease. shall be given to Wm Turkey in consideration  
of the expense of my funeral -

I hereby nominate and appoint My Son in Law Wm Turkey  
and Mr. John Judge My Executors to carry into effect the  
provisions of this my will. and I further appoint the said  
Wm Turkey my residuary Legatee -
