- I Abraham v. Dierstein of the township of Blenheim in the County of Oxford, Canada West. (yeoman), being in health of body and of sound mind memory and understanding, do make ordain and constitute this my last Will and Testament, in
1. manner of form following. I revoke all Wills ever before
 2. made by me. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Maria v. Dierstein such house furniture as follows viz, two good beds, one table, chairs, the cooking stove with what belongs to the said stove, that Jacob my son shall & will find, keep & maintain her during her life in all things of necessary, that after her death the then remaining property of hers shall be divided in equal shares or parts to each & every of his children.
 3. Thirdly, do I give devise and bequeath to my son Jacob v. Dierstein after my death my Lot of Land which I now occupy with all the improvements thereon, being now my real estate, and that he will & shall after my death, & within three years time, pay the different sums of money as follows, one year after my death, one hundred Dollars to my son Elias, such a sum of one hundred Dollars a year after to my son Henry, and a year after the sum of fifty Dollars to my grandchild Elisabeth Springer.
 4. Fourthly, is it my will, that after my death, the then remaining property (moveable,) ^{things} after paying my ^{debts} just debts shall be divided ^{by} and between my surviving children:

5. And lastly, I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint, my sole executors of this my last Will and Testament, my sons, Henry & Jacob v. Dierstein both in the township of Blenheim County of Oxford. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this tenth day of October, in the year of our Lord 1853.
