Humbly Sheweth

That your Petitioner is the widow of the late Thomas Doby
late of the Village of Ingersoll in the District of Brook Blacksmith
deceased, that the said Thomas Doby departed this life at Ingersoll
aforesaid on the fifth day of November Six thousand eight hundred and
forty Seven without having made any will, or disposition of his personal
estate which amounts as near as your Petitioner has been enabled to
ascertain to the sum of One hundred and twenty five pounds and that
your Petitioner is desirous of being admitted to administer to the
said estate. Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays you Honor will be
pleased to admit your Petitioner to administer to the estate and effects
of her said husband, ~~according to law~~ within the District aforesaid. And
your Petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray.

are held and firmly bound to *The Governor General of the*

The condition of this Obligation is such, that if the ^{said} ~~within~~ ^{within} bounden *Elizabeth Doby* administrator ⁱⁿ of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of *Thomas Doby late of Ingersoll in the District of York Blacksmith*

deceased, to make or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular, the goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come into the hands, possession or knowledge of ~~me~~ ^{me} the said *Elizabeth Doby*

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for ~~me~~ ^{me} and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited in to the registry of ~~the~~ ^{the} *County Court*, on or before the *first* ~~first~~ ^{first} ~~day~~ ^{day} of ~~the~~ ^{the} *month of January* ensuing, and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all and other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, at the time of ~~his~~ ^{his} death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of the said *Elizabeth Doby*

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons, for ~~me~~ ^{me} do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make or cause to be made, a true and just account of ~~the~~ ^{the} said administration, at or before the *first* ~~first~~ ^{first} ~~day~~ ^{day} of ~~the~~ ^{the} *month of January* 184*3*, and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said ~~administration~~ ^{administration} accounts, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the Court, for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively, as the said Judge by his decree or sentence, conformably to the provisions in a certain Act of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for the better settling intestate Estates," and passed in the twenty-second and twentieth-third year of the reign of Charles 2d, and also in a certain Act passed in the First year of King James 2, contained, shall limit and appoint, and if it shall hereafter appear, that any last Will and Testament was made by the deceased, and the *Execu* or *execu* therein named do exhibit the same unto the said Court, making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said *Elizabeth Doby*
