Wherefore your Petitioner humbly prays your Excellency would please to take his Case into consideration and grant him two hundred acres of the waste lands of the Crown

At a Court of General Quarter
Sessions of the Peace, holden at the Township
of Charlottetown, on the twentieth day of
December in the fifty sixth year of His
Majesty's Reign. Personally appeared John

describes himself to be in the within
Petition, that he is twenty one years
of age, upwards. That he never drawn
any Land, or received any, or an Order for Land from
the Crown.
