of Norwich in the County of Oxford and District of Brock in the
Province of Canada who are held and firmly bound to *Sir Charles Bagot Bt. G.*
C. B. Governor General of British North America and to his Successors

of the Province of Canada, in the sum of *One hundred*
and Twenty Pounds
Pounds Currency, to be paid to the said *Sir Charles Bagot and his*
Successors in the office Government of British North America

for which payment to be well any truly made we firmly bind ourselves, our heirs, execu-
tors and administrators, and each of us severally, separately and apart from the other of
us bindeth *himself, his* heirs, executors and administrators, firmly by these presents.

Sealed with our Seal, and dated this *25th*

Day of *February* 1843

The condition of this Obligation is such, that if the within bounden

deceased, to make or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular,
the goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come into the
hands, possession or knowledge of *the said Samuel Emigh and*

George Emigh
or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for *them* and the same so
made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited in to the registry of *the Superior Court*, on or before
the *twenty fifth* day of *August* ensuing, and the same goods,
chattels and credits, and all and other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased,
at the time of *his* death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession
of the said *Samuel Emigh and George Emigh*

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons, for *them* do well and
truly administer according to law, and further do make or cause to be made, a true and
just account of *the* said administration, at or before the *twenty fifth* day of
February 1843 and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits,
which shall be found remaining upon the said administrators accounts, the same being
first examined and allowed by the Judge of the Court, for the time being, shall deliver and

To John Arnold Esquire Judge of the
Surrogate Court of the Brock District.

The Petition of William Emigh of the Township
of Norwich in the Brock District. Yeoman.

Sheweth unto your honor.

That sometime in or about the month of
February last one George Emigh the Elder of the
said Township of Norwich deceased, departed
this life without leaving any last Will or
Testament for the disposal of his real and
personal estate. That since that time one
Samuel Emigh of the same Township of Norwich
Yeoman, ^{together with one} and George Emigh the younger of the same
place yeoman applied to your honor and
did procure of your honor Letters of
Administration for the administering the
said estate and for that purpose procured
one John C. Emigh of the same Township
of Norwich yeoman together with one Nathaniel
Footer of the same place yeoman ~~to~~ as sureties
to enter into a certain bond for the duty
administering the said estate. That at the
time of the death of the said George Emigh deceased
there were and still are living the Widow of the
said George Emigh deceased your petitioner
who is the eldest son of the said George Emigh
deceased and four other sons of whom the
said Samuel Emigh is the second after your
petitioner and the said George Emigh the
younger the youngest; that before the
granting of the said Letters of administration
your petitioner was willing and did intend
to administer the said estate; that the said

Samuel Smith and George Smith the younger
did collusively and contravene ^{your petitioners} ~~the said~~ Government
obtain the ^{said} letters of administration without
first notifying your petitioners or citing him
to appear before your honor. To ~~the~~ cause
as the next of kin to the said George Smith deceased
why the administration of the said estate should
not be granted unto them; that your petitioners
at the time of the death of the said George Smith
deceased did, and has ever since resided within
this Province; that the said Samuel Smith
and George Smith the younger in pursuance
of the said letters of administration have ad-
-verted the moveable property of the said
estate to be sold on Saturday next; that he
believes it is the intention of the said Samuel
Smith deceased and George Smith the younger
if possible to deprive your petitioners of his
interest or share in the personal effects of
the said estate; that the said Wm. C. Smith
and Nathaniel Foster your petitioners believes
to be in insufficient circumstances to answer
any claim which might be prosecuted for the
mal-administration of the said estate.

Your petitioners therefore humbly prays
your honor to repeal and revoke the
said letters of administration so granted
as aforesaid, and to grant a citation by
or an order upon the said Samuel Smith
and George Smith the younger to suspend a stay
all further proceedings under and by virtue
