Blenheim are at the disposal of Your
Excellency and humbly prays that they
may be assigned to him as his said grant

The Petitioner has an Order in Council of the
17th May last for his allowance of Land accor-
ding to his Rank (Lieutenant Colonel) for
upwards of 24 Years Service, which has
not been located,

Lot 19 in the 4th Concession of Oxford
Eastern Division is located in the name
of Ebenezer Hill, under Order in Council
of the 11th August 1797.

Under Order in Council of the 26th Oct
1827 John Howden was permitted to pur-
chase the South half of Lot 10 in the
second Concession of Oxford West -

The Western Lot 25 in 2nd Concession
of same Township containing about 50 Acs
is vacant Crown Land Subject to Grace
& Callings please (and Lot 20 in the
second Concession of Blenheim is also
vacant

In Council 11th October 1838

By the late Act of the Provincial Parliament.
Lands must be sold at auction and it is only
in cases where they have been offered for sale
& not sold that they can be acquired at an
upset price.

It is consequently not in the power of the Government
to give to the petitioner the lots of land prayed for.
