In obedience to an Order in Council of the  
5<sup>th</sup> of June 1829 to make further enquiry relative to the  
"Concessions" of the Town of Lorrain  
It is respectfully submitted  
that the Lot situated on the South branch  
of the River Thames and upon reference to the  
Plan of the said Park, the Survey which laid  
out the said Township no mention is made of a  
Mill site in his remarks on the said Lot.

I was not aware of the following circumstances  
when I made the former Report on this subject,  
although it was made known to the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Peter  
Robinson after, by Mr James G Chewett, that Tho<sup>s</sup>  
Horner Esq<sup>r</sup> M.P.C. some time in May last, was  
about to make application for the Water privileges  
of a Mill, to be placed opposite to the Town plot  
in the Township of Oxford (under Order for Survey) to  
extend ~~to extend~~ up the stream in the vicinity  
of the said Lot, and that J G Chewett's answer to  
Mr Horner, was that no report could be made  
satisfactorily thereon, without knowing the  
true situation and extent, to which Mr Horner

replied, that he would survey the same Survey thereof

with the Survey of the said Survey plot.

As to the true value of the said Lot, at  
the present day, it doth not come within the  
knowledge of His Office, but under an Order in  
Council of the 25<sup>th</sup> November 1825, the Townships  
of Carradoc, Elfrid, and Moss, being in the said
