In the name of God, Amen. I Stephen Huellen of the Township of Norwich, County of Oxford, District of Brock and Province of Canada Yeoman, being at the present time infirm in Body, but of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding, thanks be to God for the same, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say:

First, I will and direct that all my funeral expences and just debts be paid as soon as conveniently may be after my decease.

Second, After my just debts are paid it is my will that my wife Lucy shall have paid to her as soon as the same can be collected upon my Securities the sum of Twenty five pounds Provincial Currency - Also I will and bequeath to her twelve sheep. - and also a Cow. -

Third, the remainder of my property I will to be applied to the good and benefit of my Son John D. in the most judicious manner that my executors can devise. -

Fourth, I nominate and appoint, Benson Loring of the Township of Norwich aforesaid Yeoman, and John A. Corneil of the same place Merchants, Executors to this my will. -

Lastly, I hereby revoke all former and other Wills by me at any time heretofore made

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eleventh - day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two. -
