In the Name of God Amen I William Fowler of the Township
of Burford and District Brock Yeoman being weak of
Body but sound in minde Blesed be God for the same.
Do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in
Manner Following First I give my soul into the hands of
Almighty God and my body be buried in a dea cemetary.
And my worldly Estate I give and devise as follows.

First I give and devise to my second son James Daniel
Fowler the south fifty acres of lot number five in the seventh
Concession, Burford: All so I give and devise to my third
son Lawrence Fowler the north half of the south half of lot
number five in Seventh Concession of Burford: And that my
son Lawrence Fowler shall have on some convenient part
of my son James Daniel Fowler here in meantime a convenient
Place for a Road unto the eighth Concession Burford:

All so I will and bequeath to my oldest son William Henry
Fowler to be paid by my son James Daniel Fowler fifty poun^d
in manner following in one year after my death he shall pay to
William Henry Fowler twenty five pounds and the second year
After my death shall pay the remaining twenty five pounds:

And I will and bequeath to my fourth son Charles
Duncumb Fowler one hundred pounds Provincial currency
And that my son James Daniel Fowler shall pay to Charles
Duncumb Fowler the sum of twenty five Pounds the third year
After my death: And so will and bequeath that my
son Lawrence Fowler shall pay to my son Charles Duncumb
Fowler the remaining Seventy five Pounds in manner following in one
year After Charles Duncumb Fowler shall be come of age he shall
Recive twenty five pounds and the second year the same

And the third year the remaining twenty five Pounds :
And I give and devise to my oldest Son William Henry Fowler
Four acres of Land being composed of the south east corner
of Lot number Four in the seventh Concession Bufford which is
forty five acres : And it is all so my will that in case of either
the above Sons should die before marriage that his succession
should be equally divided & be between the remaining three
Brothers until made away with by will and in case more should
die to be distributed in the same way : And I give and devise
to my fifth Son John Wesley Fowler the north half of the west side
of Lot number three in eighth Concession Bufford which is fifty
three acres : And I give and devise to my sixth Son George
Henry Fowler the north half of the west side of Lot number three
in the eighth Concession Bufford : And I will and bequeath
to my eldest daughter Mariah Ann Fowler twenty five Pounds
to be paid in manner following twelve pounds ten shillings to
be paid by John Wesley Fowler every year after he shall be come of
age and the sum of twelve pounds ten shillings the second
year after he shall be come of age : And I will and bequeath
to my youngest daughter the sum of twenty five pounds to be paid
in manner following the sum of twelve pounds ten shillings to be
paid to my daughter Anna at the age of eighteen by my son
John Wesley Fowler and the further sum of twelve pounds ten shillings
to be paid in like manner at the expiration of the first year after
she shall be come of age by my son John Wesley Fowler :

And I will and bequeath to my seventh Son Alexander
Fowler the sum of one hundred pounds to be paid by George
Henry Fowler in manner following that in one year after Alexander
Fowler shall be come of age shall receive twenty five pounds and

And the second year she like sum and the third year the like
sum and the fourth year the remaining twenty five pounds:
And I all so will and devise that John Wesley Fowler and
George Henry Fowler shall have forty acres of the north East
Quarter lot number seven in the tenth Concession Bufford wood
lot and that James Daniels Fowler and Samm Fowler have
Sufficient fire wood and rail Timber for the use of their own
Farms of the same: And I will and bequeath to my Beloved
Wife Eliza Fowler shall have all my moveable Property after
my debts shall be paid and shall keep the home stead until
my youngest son George Henry Fowler shall be come of age
And in case she remains my widow George Henry Fowler
is to maintain her comfortably either in his own family or by
providing for her a comfortable Room and Provisos all such
necessaries as shall keep her comfortable during her natural life
time: And it is all so my will that when the decree is taking from
the Government it shall be taking in George Henry Fowler name and
so soon as convenient after George Henry Fowler shall be come
of age twenty one he shall give a deed to John Wesley
Fowler for that part which I have willed him: And it is
my will that no deviation take place until the Home stead
be paid for at the Government office: And it is all so my will
that in case that Alexander Fowler should die my two daughters
shall have twenty five pounds a piece more given to them by
my son George Henry Fowler: And lastly my express will and
meaning is and I do now by a point my Beloved Wife Executing
And I do further appoint my Respected Friends Lawrence Daniels
Esquire and James Daniels Fowler my Executors and it is my
express will and meaning and I do hereby order and appoint

That if any differences disputes question or Controversy shall
arise or happen concerning any gift bequest
matter or thing in this my will given and bequeathed expressed
or contained that then no suit in Law or Equity or
otherwise shall be brought commenced or prosecuted for
and concerning the same but the same shall be referred
wholly to the award order and determination of my Friends
Elijah Grober and Larona Daniel Egum and James Daniel
all of my Executors and that they shall order and direct in
writing where in shall be binding and conclusive to all
and every person and persons there in concerned
