
Herbert Bodwell Glidden 1894-1915

was born on September 15, 1894 on his family's farm in West Oxford Township near Ingersoll, to parents Martha Bodwell Glidden and William F. Glidden.


Herbert enlisted to serve in World War I as a Private in the 71st Battalion,



His parents, William Glidden and his mother Martha Bodwell Glidden had




William F. Glidden, a well-to-do and prominent West Oxford farmer, dropped dead at his 'resid ice' between eight and nine o'clock S turday night. The was in Ingersoll during the day and returned home about five o'clock in the afternoon. At that time, and up to the time of his death, he appeared in his usual good health. For the amusement of the children he had been playing the violin, He laid the instrument down to place one of the children on the couch, and while doing so he fold over and expired immediately. Heart failure is given as the cause of his death. Deceased was aged 14 years and 3 months. He had been a resident of West Oxford for upwards of fifteen years and the news of his demise came as a shock to many friends, by whom he was held in the highest esteem. Herbert's brother, Joseph Glidden enlisted in September of 1914 and was associated with the 24th Grey's Horse Battalion shown below camped at Ingersoll in 1909. Joseph



survived the war, but suffered a gunshot wound to the hip in the spring of 1915 that plagued him for the duration of the war. Herbert enlisted a just few months later and dead before the new year. Joseph was given military leave on learning that his brother had died. Joseph married a girl from London, England and brought her home to Ingersoll after the war ended—they later made their home in London, Ontario.

He went to England with a special detachment of the 71st Battalion.

A younger brother was seriously in. jured several months ago in the fighting in France.




