The Petition of James Graham of the Township
 of Bedford on the Thames, Yeoman.

Humblly sheweth

That your Petitioner has been five Years in
 the Province, and has a family consisting of
 a wife and nine Children; that he has pro-
 -perty in the Province to the amount of Two
 hundred pounds Halifax, consisting of Cattle
 and Farming utensils, that he has taken
 the Oath of Allegiance and is desirous to occupy
 and improve a vacant lot of Land of the Crown.

That he is prepared and undertakes in case
 his Petition shall be favourably answered
 to pay within three days from the date of your
 Excellency's Order in Council, into the hands
 of his Majesty's Receiver General of this Province
 as well the whole of the Fees allowed by his
 Majesty to be charged on the Patent that is
 to issue, as the Fees of Survey. And your Peti-
 -tioner will within the same period produce
 to the Clerk of the Executive Council, the
 Receiver General's Receipt for such Fees.

And your Petitioner craves leave to nominate
 Thomas Hind of the Town of York, his Agent
 for receiving such Deed, and undertakes that
 the said Thomas Hind shall attend the Secre-
 -tary of the Province within twenty one days
 from

and take out such Deed.

Wherefore your Petitioner
prays your Excellency may be pleased to
grant him Two hundred acres of the waste
lands of the Crown, under the Regulations
of the 30th December 1802. -
