This is the last will and testament of Philip Graham alias Philip Percival Graham, a Commander in the Royal Navy.

I will and desire that all my just debts, funeral and testamentary expenses be paid by my Executors, as soon as may be after my decease, and as to my worldly Estate ^{wherein} ~~with~~ it hath pleased God to bless me, I give and devise as follows. I give and devise to my beloved Wife Mary, all my household goods and furniture, plate, linen and china for the term of her natural life, and I give and devise and bequeath all my real and personal Estate ~~whatssoever~~ ^{whatssoever} and thereunto unto my said Wife Mary to be by her disposed of as she shall consider just and equitable for the benefit of our children who shall be living after my decease in the full and perfect confidence that my said Wife Mary will be guided therein, under the blessing of Almighty God in whose mercy and goodness I place my hope, to do what is just and righteous towards our offspring severally and collectively and I appoint my said Wife sole executrix of this my last will, hereby revoking all other wills made by me at any time before. In witness whereof I the said Philip Graham, alias Philip Percival Graham have set my hand and seal

the 12th day of November, in the Year of our Lord 1844 (Figure 2 having been first inserted in place of Figure 1 signed, sealed, published and declared by the said testator Philip Graham as and for his last will

this Codicil fully and entirely and in all re-
spects whatsoever authorize and empower the
said Edmund Deedes of West York Esquire to
use all the powers and exercise all the pro-
ceedings whatsoever in him by Law Empowered and
required in the due fulfillment of the duties and

York this twentieth day of November in the year of
