Know all Men by these Presents that we, *Dorothy Grout of the State of Indiana in the United States of America. Widow of the late Anson Harley Grout deceased. Willard Wentzel Grout of the Township of Terra. and George Chansey Grout of Terra aforesaid. Farmer* are held and firmly bound to *Sir Charles Bagot G. C. B. - Governor General of British North America and his Successors -* of the Province of Canada, in the sum of *Fifty x + + +*

Pounds Currency, to be paid to the said *Sir Charles Bagot and his Successors as aforesaid -*

for which payment to be well any truly made we firmly bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, and each of us severally, separately and apart from the other of us bindeth *himself, then* heirs, executors and administrators, firmly by these presents.

Sealed with our Seal, and dated this *23*

Day of *September* 1844

The condition of this Obligation is such, that if the within bounden

administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of *Anson Harley Grout formerly of the Township of Terra in the District of Brock aforesaid*

deceased, do make or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular, the goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come into the hands, possession or knowledge of *her* the said *Dorothy Grout*

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for *her* and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited in to the registry of the *Sheriff's Court*, on or before the *Twenty first* day of *September* ensuing, and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all and other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, at the time of *his* death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of the said *Dorothy Grout*

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons, for *her* do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make or cause to be made, a true and just account of *her* said administration, at or before the *Twenty first* day of *September* 1843 and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said administration & accounts, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the Court, for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively, as the said Judge by his decree or sentence, conformably to the provisions in a certain Act of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for the better settling intestate Estates," and passed in the twenty-second and twenth-third year of the reign of Charles 2d, and also in a certain Act passed in the First year of King James 2, contained, shall limit and appoint, and if it shall hereafter appear, that any last Will and Testament was made by the deceased, and the Exec^{utor} or execut^{rix} therein named do exhibit the same unto the said Court, making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said *Dorothy Grout*

within bounden, being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration [approbation of such testament being first had and made] in the said Court, then this Obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in full force and virtue.
