Will you, therefore, have the goodness to obtain His Excellency's consent to set apart for me lot No. 11 in the north concession of Blandford, as well as 200 acres of the "Government Reservation" in that township, where Colonel Delatre & Capt. Poore have been permitted to locate themselves.
