200 Acre of Land under Order in Council of the
5th March 1835 that he located, in part of the

the Township of Combermere of the Township of
Terra Firma upon satisfying the Surveyor General and
the Commissioner of Crown Lands that there
was no settlement duty of any kind done upon
the said half Lot

That the said half Lot was located many
years since by one Philip Widenman who has
above stated that such an irregularity, but
who has since Your Petitioner's location brought
forward a certificate of settlement duty upon
which the Surveyor General has written to Your
Petitioner to surrender his location of that
half Lot.

That Your Petitioner will be prepared
to prove the verity of his former statement
as to the time of his location, by the certificate

upon the said Hay Lot.

We therefore pray Your Excellency may
be pleased to allow him two Months from this
date to bring forward a Certificate as above
stated; upon his producing which, perfectly
satisfactory, we pray Your Excellency may
be pleased to confirm him in his said
Location - And that until which time, as before
proposed, it may remain to both parties in
a state of perfect rest. -
