In the Name of God Amen

I Daniel Hayou the younger of the Town-  
ship of Blenheim in the County of  
Oxford and Province of New Brunswick  
German. I am being of sound mind  
memory and judgement, (thanks be to  
Almighty God for the same,) but being very  
sick and calling to mind the shortness  
and uncertainty of this mortal life and  
that it is appointed unto men once to  
die, do make and publish this my last  
Will and Testament, in manner and form  
following. And first I will that after my  
decease, my body be buried in decent  
Christian burial, at the discretion of my  
Executors, in certain hope of a joyful  
Resurrection, and I commend my soul into  
the hands of Almighty God, trusting in  
the merits of my Lord and Saviour Jesus  
Christ for Eternal life. And as touching  
such worldly Estate as it has pleased God  
to bless me with in this life, I dispose of as  
follows: I will that my farm being the East half  
of the South half of Lot Number Twelve in  
the Twelfth Concession of the said Township  
of Blenheim, be rented or sold to the best  
advantage, at the discretion of my Executors  
and the proceeds divided as follows, if the  
said farm is rented, I will that my beloved  
wife



wife Jane, shall have one third and then  
my Father and Mother - Daniel and Charlotte  
Hagow shall have the other two thirds during  
their natural lives, and in Case my Executors shall  
see proper to sell my said farms, then I will that  
the money arising therefrom be placed at Interest  
and divided as above, and in Case one of  
my parents should survive the other, and my  
wife should survive, I will that my wife shall  
then have two thirds of my said Estate, and at  
the decease of both of my parents, then I will  
that the whole of my said Estate come to my  
dear wife Jane, and in Case my respected  
heir shall survive, I will that my said Estate  
shall come to him or her at the Age of Twenty  
one years, reserving always nevertheless unto my  
said wife Jane, the benefits of my whole estate  
after the decease of my said parents, and during  
my her widowhood, and I will that if my  
said wife should survive my said Res-  
pected heir, then that she my said wife Jane  
shall fully have and enjoy all my said  
Estate, and I will that my said beloved  
wife Jane Hagow shall have and enjoy all  
my personal property and Estate after my  
just and lawful debts shall be paid.  
And lastly I nominate constitute and appoin-  
t my dear and respected friends Elias  
G. Chamberlain, and Andrew Oliver of Wash-  
-ington in the said Township of Plumtree  
Baltimore



5 I intended to be Executors to this my last  
will and Testament And revoking all other  
or former Wills Testaments, Legacies, gifts or  
bequests, by me or <sup>Executors</sup> any wife made or  
appointed heretofore, I declare this to be  
my last Will and Testament.

Thousand Eight hundred and fifty five.

Oxford Messieurs and Andrew Oliver of the said Village Messieurs  
Make Executors of the last Will and Testament of Daniel Hagon  
the younger late of the said Township of Blenheim deceased  
Humbly Sheweth

That the said Daniel Hagon the younger departed this  
life at the said Township on or about the fifteenth day of July  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six  
having first on the Eleventh day of July aforesaid duly made and  
published his last Will and Testament in writing whereby he
