The Petition of Samuel Hall
of Bedford on Thames, Yeoman

Assembly sheweth -

That your Petitioner has resided
on the bottom front Lot N: 14 in the above named
Township, with his family, since June 1796
that desirous to occupy the Lot N: 14 in the 1st Con-
tying in his rear, he purchased the same from
Daniel Muck the original holder, for the sum
of One Hundred and Seventy pounds, New York
which sum your petitioner has paid and satisfied

That in January 1799 the said Daniel Muck
broke his leg, and died thereof in a few days, in
the above named Township - Your Petitioner therefore
humbly requests of your Excellency, that a grant
may issue in his own Name for Lot N: 14. 1 Con-
on payment of the usual fees, and as in duty bound
your petitioner shall ever pray - Samuel Hall

I Thomas Ingersoll of the Township of
 Bedford, River Thames, do certify, that some
 time about the month of June 1797 - (as then ^{proposed}
 of the above named Township) I recommended a Person
 whose name was Daniel Muck, under the name of
 Samuel Muck, thro' mistake of his Christian name,
 for Lot N^o. 14 - 1st Concession of Bedford - that the said
 Daniel Muck lived on the said Lot and made some
 improvement on it, and then sold the Lot to one
 Samuel Hall (who has resided upon the broken part
 thereof) for the sum of one hundred and seventy pounds
 Currency of New York, which Money has to my certain
 Knowledge been paid by Hall to Muck -
 That in January 1799, the said Daniel Muck
 having broke his leg by accident, died thereof in a few
 days. leaving no one of his family in the Province
 nor has any of his family ever resided in it to my
 Knowledge -
