Humbly Iewell

That the late James Hemmings late of the Township of Blenheim in the County
of Oxford wherein departed this life at the said Township of Blenheim on
or about the thirtieth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and fifty seven without having made any Will so far as your
Petitioner has been enabled to ascertain. That she has made diligent search
for all Will of the said deceased but has not been enabled to discover any such will.
That your petitioner is the only relative of the said deceased residing in Canada
and a sister of the said deceased. That the said deceased at the time of his
death was unmarried and died without leaving any issue then surviving.
That at the time of the death of the said James Hemmings he was possessed
of a Battalid to divers goods and chattels right and credits all within
the County of Oxford amounting to the sum of twenty five pounds
or thereabouts so far as your petitioner has been enabled to ascertain. That
as yet no Letters of administration of the estate of the said deceased have been
granted. Your petitioner therefore humbly prays you soon will be pleased

Administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels, and
credits of James Hemmings deceased, do make, or cause to be
made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels, and credits, of the
said deceased, which have or shall come into the hands, possession, or knowledge of her
the said Lydia Thurnham or into the hands and possession of
any other person or persons for her and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be
exhibited into the Registry of the Probate Court on or before the first
Monday in June next ensuing, and the same goods, chattels, and credits,
and all other the goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased, at the time of her
death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of the said
Lydia Thurnham or into the hands
and possession of any other person or persons for her do well and truly administer
according to law, and further do make or cause to be made a true and just account of her
said administration, at or before the first eleven day of January 1653
and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels, and credits, which shall be found
remaining upon the said Administrator account, the same being first examined and
allowed by the Judge of the Court for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such person
