I, John Bain, Woodstock, Brock District Canada West, Cabinet Maker, partner in Business with George Hendry Cabinet Maker, of the said place, now lately deceased, beg to represent to Your Honour that the said George Hendry expired at Woodstock on the fourth day of October instant; That he died intestate, leaving four children the eldest, Christina, aged eleven years, the second, William, aged five years, the third, Helen, aged three years, and the fourth, Catharine, aged one year. That said Guardian children have no guardian legal Guardian, and that their mother the widow of the ~~husband~~ of the late George Hendry, in consequence of occasional mental derangement is unfit to be entrusted with the charge of said children. Know all Men by these presents that the Reverend William Hedges Landon of Woodstock in the District of Brock in that part of the Province of Canada hitherto called Upper Canada Baptist Minister James Simpson of the same place Cabinet Maker and James Scarff of the same place Blacksmith are jointly and severally held and firmly bound to Christiana Hendry William Hendry Helen Hendry and Catharine Hendry the Infant Children of the late George Hendry late of the Town of Woodstock in the District aforesaid Cabinet Maker deceased and now residing in the Town aforesaid and to each of them in the sum of Five Hundred Pounds of lawful Money of Canada to be paid to the said Christiana Hendry William Hendry Helen Hendry and Catharine Hendry or their or each of their Cestum Attorneys Executors Administrators or Assigns for which payment to be well and truly made we bind ourselves our and each of our said Executors and Administrators firmly by these presents.

Sealed with our Seals Dated this thirteenth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and forty seven

Whereas the abovebounden William Hedges Landon having been this day appointed Guardian to the abovesigned Infant Children of the late George Hendry late of the Town of Woodstock aforesaid Cabinet Maker deceased by William Lapointe Esquire Judge of the Surrogate Court of the District of Brock the said William Hedges Landon hath agreed as such Guardian as aforesaid to enter into the securities required by law for the due performance of his duties as such Guardian as aforesaid and hath named the abovebounden James Simpson and James Scarff securities for the due fulfillment of such duties. Now the Condition of this Bond or Obligation is such that if William Hedges Landon shall and do faithfully perform the said Office of Guardian and if the said William Hedges Landon his Executors or Administrators shall account to whom and as each of the said Christiana Hendry, William Hendry, Helen Hendry and Catharine Hendry shall respectively become of the full Age of twenty one Years or whenever the said Guardianship shall be determined or sooner if thereunto required by the Judge of the said Court render to each of the said Christiana Hendry, William Hendry, Helen Hendry, and Catharine Hendry or to her, his, or their respective Executors or Administrators a true and just Account of all Goods, Monies, Realts, profits or Property of each of them the said Christiana Hendry, William Hendry, Helen Hendry and Catharine Hendry which shall have come into the hands of him the said William Hedges Landon and shall and do thereupon deliver and pay over to the said Christiana Hendry, William Hendry, Helen Hendry, and Catharine Hendry or to her, his, or their respective Executors or Administrators the Property or the sum or balance of Money which may be in the hands of the said William Hedges Landon belonging to each of them the said Christiana Hendry, William Hendry, Helen Hendry and Catharine Hendry only deducting therefrom and retaining a reasonable sum for the Expenses and Charges of the said William Hedges Landon. Then and in that case the above written Bond or Obligation shall be null and void.

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for *them* and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited in to the registry of *the Justice of the Peace* Court, on or before the *first Monday in April* of the year *1842* ensuing, and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all and other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, at the time of *his* death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of the said *John Bain*
