wishes to locate in that Township are the Lotsn<sup>o</sup>. 16 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Concessionn<sup>o</sup>. 3 in the 7<sup>th</sup> ConcessionThe Lot n<sup>o</sup>. 16 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Concession has been asked for  
many years by the Petitioner, and his name is  
inserted thereon. but he has received elsewhere  
600 acres, the amount of the order in pencil in his  
favor.The Lot n<sup>o</sup>. 3 in the 7<sup>th</sup> Concession is entered in the  
name of Thomas Watson, who has received the
