The Condition of this obligation is such, that if the above-named *James Emery Huxson* the administrator of all the personal estate and effects, rights and credits of *William Huxson* late of the *Township of Decker* in the County of *Oxford* deceased, (who died on the *twelfth* day of *June* A. D. 1859,) do, when lawfully called on in that behalf, make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the personal estate and effects, rights, and credits of the said deceased which have or shall come into the hands, possession, or knowledge of the said *James Emery Huxson* or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for *him* and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Surrogate Court of the *County of Oxford* whenever required by Law
