Esquire Judge of the Surrogate Court of the County  
of Oxford and the said Margaret Hurley has assent  
to required by law to the being security to the said Infant  
Children aforesaid for the due discharge of her duties  
as such Guardian

Now the Condition of the foregoing Bond  
or obligation is such that if the said ~~Mary and Hurley~~  
Mary and Hurley do and shall faithfully perform  
the duties imposed in her as such Guardian and if  
the said Mary and Hurley her Executors Administrators  
and assigns do and shall when the said Infant Children shall  
respectively attain the age of twenty one years or when ever the said  
Guardianship shall be determined or sooner if they or required by  
the Judge of the said Court render to the said Infant Children aforesaid  
or to either of them or either of their Executors or Administrators a  
true and just account of all goods monies interest rents profits or property  
of the said Infant Children or either of them which shall come into the  
hands of the said Margaret Hurley and will thereupon without delay
