This is the last Will and Testament of me Margaret King of the Township of Zorra County of Oxford Canada Nod Widow I direct my Executors hereinafter named or the survivor of them his Executors or Administrators to stand and continue possessors of all Money Notes or other securities for Money Goods Chattels & Estate and Effects of what nature or kind soever or wheresoever the same may be at the time of my death and to collect and then divest the same as soon as may be in good full and absolute securities and to collect and invest the interest on the same upon Trust for the benefit of my two Children Maria Jane and James I demand until they shall have attained especially the age of Twentyone years, Then I give and bequeath the Principal & Interest accumulated excepting such part thereof as my Executors may have deemed necessary to expend in their Education to be equally divided between my said two Children but in case either of them should die without leaving lawfull issue then the whole to be paid to the survivor but should either of the said children die leaving lawfull issue then the said issue to be paid his or her share but should it please God to take both my said children before they shall have attained the majority then I give and bequeath the whole of the then accumulated property to my Brothers and Sisters or to their lawful issue respectively share and share alike that is the children of any of my brothers or sisters to receive their deceased parents share out of this general bequest I except my household furniture and effects all of which I give and bequeath to my Brother Jane Doughty and I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint Executors and Trustees of this my Will William Powell of Blanford town and my Brother Daniel Doughty and declare my said Executors or the executors of either of them shall be answerable for such sums only as they shall respectively receive by virtue of the trusts hereby in them imposed In witness whereof I the said Margaret King have at the bottom hereof subscribed my name and set my hand and seal this sixteenth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty six A.M.
