Know all Men by these Presents that we, *Betty Larkin of the Township of Bedford (Eastern Division) in the District of North West part of the Province of Canada, heretofore called Upper Canada* widow of the late *Richard Larkin* late of the said Township and diocese or *parish* deceased *Salmon Hill* and *Tom Hill* both of the said Township and diocese or *parish* are held and firmly bound to *The Governor General of Canada*

of the Province of Canada, in the sum of *One hundred and fifty*

Pounds Currency, to be paid to the said *Governor General*.

for which payment to be well any truly made we firmly bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, and each of us severally, separately and apart from the other of us bindeth ~~him~~ <sup>myself</sup>, ~~heirs~~, <sup>heirs</sup>, executors and administrators, firmly by these presents.

Sealed with our Seal, and dated this *24<sup>th</sup>* Day of *September* 184*3*

**The condition of this Obligation** is such, that if the ~~within~~ <sup>above</sup> bounden

*Betty Larkin* <sup>is</sup> administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of *the late Richard Larkin* late of the said Township of *Bedford (Eastern Division)* in the District of *Upper Canada* *Salmon Hill*

deceased, to make or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular, the goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come into the hands, possession or knowledge of ~~her~~ the said *Betty Larkin*

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for ~~her~~ and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited in to the registry of *the Superior Court*, on or before the *last Monday of some day of November* ensuing, and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all and other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, at the time of ~~his~~ death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of the said *Betty Larkin*

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons, for ~~her~~ do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make or cause to be made, a true and just account of ~~the~~ said administration, at or before the *last Monday of September* ~~1843~~ *1840* and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said administration ~~the~~ accounts, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the Court, for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively, as the said Judge by his decree or sentence, conformably to the provisions in a certain Act of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for the better settling intestate Estates," and passed in the twenty-second and twentieth-third year of the reign of Charles 2d, and also in a certain Act passed in the First year of King James 2, contained, shall limit and appoint, and if it shall hereafter appear, that any last Will and Testament was made by the deceased, and the Execu ~~or~~ <sup>or</sup> execu therein named do exhibit the same unto the said Court, making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said *Betty Larkin*

within bounden, being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration [approbation of such testament being first had and made] in the said Court, then this Obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in full force and virtue
