of the said Township of Blenheim to hold the same during her natural
life, and at her death I will that all my said real estate become the
property of my son William Leader, provided he my said son William
Leader, do pay to my daughter by grace's family
Mary son John James Leader the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, young
daughter Phoda W. Leader the sum of one hundred dollars, and to my dear
son Peter Henry Leader the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars. I will that
my son Joseph Leader shall have and hold possession of three acres, part of my land
or lots no fourteenth during his natural life or during his master's lifetime together
to my said real estate hereinafter mentioned, and I
leuly I nominate constable and appraiser my friend Noah Ross of Blenheim

this my last will and testament, and appointing all and every other link or
