In the name of God, Amen, I Abner Lewis  
of the Township of Dereham, County of Oxford, District  
of Brock, Province of Canada Yeman, being at the present  
time weak in body, and considering the shortness and  
uncertainty of life, and being in thankfulness to God, of  
sound mind and memory, do make this my last will and  
testament, in manner and form following, that is to say.

First. I will and direct, that all my just debts and funeral  
expenses shall be paid and satisfied out of my personal  
Estate, as soon as conveniently may be after my decease.

Second. I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Laura Lewis  
all my personal and moveable property whatsoever, and  
this, together with the privileges hereinafter named, is to  
be understood to be in lieu of and instead of her right to  
dower. And so long as my said wife shall remain my  
widow, and until the oldest of my two sons hereinafter  
named, shall arrive to the age of twenty one years; she shall  
have the management and control, and enjoy the profits  
and proceeds of the north half of lot number sixteen in  
the second concession of Dereham aforesaid, containing  
one hundred acres, be the same more or less, remembering that,  
it is my will that my two sons Heman and Emerson shall  
be provided for in the mean time out of the proceeds of my  
said farm. — And should she continue my widow after  
that period of time, it is my will that she shall enjoy  
and receive ~~an~~ <sup>one-half</sup> part of the proceeds and profits of  
her said ~~one~~ <sup>one-half</sup> hundred acres, so long as she shall continue

the Fifty acres left to my Son Emerson, until my said  
Son Emerson shall arrive to the age of twenty one,

And should she continue my widow after the last  
mentioned periods of time, it is my will that, she should  
shall enjoy and receive one third part of the proceeds  
and profits of the said one hundred acres, so long as  
shall continue my widow; but when she ceases to be my  
widow, her right, or claim to the said real Estate or  
any part thereof, is to cease, and she is no longer to derive  
any profit, or support, therefrom.

Third - I give and bequeath unto my Son Heman Lewis, when  
he shall arrive at the age of twenty one years, the north  
west equal quarter, of the said lot number sixteen, in the  
second concession, of Dereham, aforesaid, containing fifty acres  
more or less. To have and to hold the same unto my said  
Son Heman his heirs and assigns for ever.

Fourth - I give and bequeath unto my Son Emerson Lewis  
when he shall arrive at the age of twenty one, the north  
East, equal quarter of the said lot, number sixteen, containing  
fifty acres, more or less. To have and to hold, the same  
unto my said Son Emerson his heirs and assigns for ever.

Fifth - I give and bequeath unto my Son Edgar Lewis, the  
sum of five shillings. The reason whereof is, I have committed  
him in confidence to the kind and friendly charge, of  
Warren Harris, and I charge my said beloved Son, to be  
obedient and faithful to the said Warren Harris, until  
he shall come of age, as there remains, no doubt, with me.

that the said Warren Harris will fairly and justly reward  
the faithful services of my said son.

Sixth - whatsoever I may leave, at the time of my death, not  
hereinbefore disposed of, I give to my two sons Herman  
and Emerson to be equally divided between them.

Lastly - I nominate and appoint Warren Harris and George  
Pratermaw both of Ditcham aforesaid, Yeoman, Executors  
of this my will. In witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand and seal this eleventh day of July in the year  
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty six.
