Justices of the peace for the London District of Upper Canada  
This thirteenth day of June One thousand eight hundred and  
thirty four and maketh oath that he has had lot N<sup>o</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> on the  
3<sup>d</sup> Concession of the township of Zorra, being a clayey morass,  
under lease since October 1830. That he duly maketh over all  
his right and title to the West half of the said lot to his  
Son in law Robert Campbell, he being satisfied with the  
East half

Robert Campbell late a private in the 79 Regt of Foot  
also maketh oath that he has resided on the said West half  
of the said lot since the 7 of Jan<sup>y</sup> 1831, and having built a  
substantial house, and made many improvements on the  
aforesaid ground, besides clearing upwards of 14 Acres,  
having a very large family, he prays that His Excellency  
for John Colborne will be pleased to allow him to exchange  
his lot in Blenheim, for the above ground.
