guidance to settlers & required either some sanction or order
to establish the boundaries of the Gore laid down by
my survey, or an order to an authorized Surveyor to
examine its correctness —

The Petitioner therefore respectfully asks
in favor — that an order be given to the
Surveyor General — in some way to sanction
said survey — or that he authorize and direct
a government Surveyor to examine & report
the same —
