The Last Will and Testament of Solomon Lapping  
Made at Norwich on the Fifth Day of June in the Year of Our  
Lord One thousand Eight Hundred and Forty four Witnesseth that  
my desire is that my just debts if any and funeral Charges be Promptly  
Paid

Secondly to my son Albert if upon a Settlement of my Charges  
and the still rent he has not received his share <sup>whether</sup> ~~deficiency~~ there is  
in Making him equal to Horace and John shall be Paid in the  
Purchase of Land for him and if he goes on in ~~the~~ building a saw  
mill my will is that he have the use of it a reasonable time to  
get his pay for ~~the~~ building it and according to agreement he  
is to have the use of the house he lives in as long as he chooses to live  
in it and then to deliver it up without any charge

Thirdly I will and bequeath unto my sons John and Augustus  
the Hundred acres <sup>and to them their and assigned</sup> of Land that I own in Buxford for them to  
divide as they Pleas and also the Property I have them charged with  
also I will unto my son Horace the Hundred acres on which he  
lives to have and hold to himself this his and Assigns forever and  
also the Property I have him charged with

Also I will that Eugenia and Hannah my two Daughters have  
all the Property they are charged with and each of them one  
early maple Table and to Eugenia a bedstead now making

Also my will is that my Daughters Annamaria and Phebe  
have an Equal outsett with my other Daughters on their Marri-  
age or when twenty one years of age if not Married

And I further will that my Farm of three hundred acres  
shall be Equally Divided between my four Sons Richard  
Peter Solomon and Stephen After the Decease of my  
beloved wife and Richard has a horse and I expect him to learn

Solomon the trade of Carding and Cloth Dressing and  
I will that Peter Solomon and Stephen shall each  
turn Over

have a good young horse Saddle and Bridle when they  
arrive to the Age of Seventyone years and if Solomon get  
the Trade I expect that Richard and him have the Priviledge  
of Running the machinery or Letter of them at a fair and  
Easy Rent and the Priviledg of Purchasing the Machinery  
including the fulling mill and its appurtenances at a fair  
Price and Easy terms and further when Peter and Stephen  
arrive at age and Solomon <sup>if</sup> dont get the trade they shall  
have the Grist and Saw mill at a fair and Easy rent  
untill after the Decease of my wife when my will is that  
they have them in addition to their Lands and as I consider  
the fulling mill and all its appurtenances with the Carding  
Machinery Movable Property my will is that after the  
Decease of my wife all my movable Property be sold  
and Equally Divided amongst all my Children  
Lastly I make Constitute ordain and Appoint my  
Beloved wife Louisa my Executrix with my <sup>son</sup> John and my  
Son in Law Lawrence T Hunt Executors jointly with her  
to assist her in carrying out the intentions of this my  
will and I will to my wife the full controll of all my  
Movables with the house we occupy and every thing further  
to Make her Comfortable during her life but if she  
choos to Marry again she is to have no further control  
but the Executors are to take the management  
Signed Sealed and Acknowledged by Solomon Lopping  
as his last will and Testament before us at Norwich on  
the Day and Year above Written
