Know all Men by these PRESENTS, that we *James McCloghdale of the Township of West Yema in the County of Bedford in the Province of Nova Scotia Augustus Nelson and James Matheson* of the said Township of Yema

are held and firmly bound to *His Excellency Sir Samuel Waller Mad Bart* Governor General of British North America

and to his Successor and Successors in Office, in the sum of *two thousand four hundred* Pounds of lawful money of the said Province, to be paid to *His Majesty Queen Victoria*

and her Successors; for which payment, to be well and truly made, we bind ourselves severally, our Heirs, and each of our Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, firmly by these Presents. Sealed with our Seals, and dated at *Windsorlock* in the *County of Bedford* this *fourth* day of *September* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *forty six*

THE CONDITION of this obligation is such, that if the *within* bounden *James*

McCloghdale

Administrat^{or} of all and singular the goods, chattels, and credits of *Donald McCloghdale* deceased, do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels, and credits, of the said deceased, which have or shall come into the hands, possession, or knowledge of *him* the said *James McCloghdale* or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for *him* and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the *Sheriff of the County of Bedford* on or before the *last* Monday in *March* next ensuing, and the same goods, chattels, and credits, and all other the goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased, at the time of *his* death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of the said *James McCloghdale*

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for *him* do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make or cause to be made a true and just account of *his* said administration, at or before the *fourth* day of *September 1857*

and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels, and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said Administrat^{or} account, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the Court for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons, respectively, as the said Judge by his decree or sentence, conformably to the provisions in a certain Act of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for the better settling Intestate Estates," and passed in the twenty-second and twenty-third year of the reign of Charles II, and also in a certain Act passed in the first year of King James II, contained, shall limit and appoint; and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will or Testament was made by the deceased, and the Executor or Executors therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court, making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said *James*

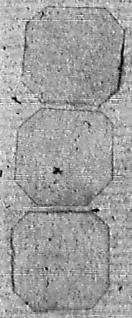
