of the Township of Loran - formerly
a Sgt. in the 93rd Reg^t
Humbly Sheweth

That your Petitioner is a Native of
Scotland that he emigrated to this
Province in 1820 - with some of his
Countrymen, and settled in the Township of
Loran - that your Petitioner, applied
for a grant of Land, a short time
after coming into this Country, but was
informed that he must stand in the
Military District which would have
detached him from the party with whom
he came out - Your Petitioner therefore
allowed his Application to stand over - when
in June 1833 - he received an Order of
Council for 200 Acres - Your Petitioner
now humbly prays Your Excellency, that
the said grant may be resumed in the
Township of Loran, in which Your
Petitioner already has property and his
family are residing thereon - the Petitioner's
object being to settle his family on the
grant, should it be Your Excellency's
pleasure.
