or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for *her* and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited in to the registry of *the County of York* Court, on or before the *last Monday* day of *March* ensuing, and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all and other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, at the time of *his* death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of the said *Margaret Galt*
