Two Hundred Acres of the Waste Crown Land
on the terms usually granted to the sons of U. E.
Loyalists; and further that your Excellency will
be pleased to allow Mahlon Burwell of Southwold
in the District aforesaid, Esquire, to locate the same,
And your Petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray.
