a lot he purchased in the Township of Bedford,  
that he has a family consisting of a Wife and  
Three Children. That he has property in this  
Province to the amount of one Hundred pounds  
Sterling, consisting of Cattle, Farming Utensils,  
&c. That he has taken the Oath of Allegiance  
and has never received any Lands or Orders for  
Lands from the Crown. That he is desirous to  
obtain a Grant of the waste Lands of the Crown  
and begs leave to state that he is prepared  
and undertakes, in case his Petition should be  
favourably answered, to pay within the limited  
time the whole of the Patent fee and fees of  
Survey & That he will attend the Secretary of  
the

the Province within twenty one days from the date of the order in Council and take out the Patent.

Wherefore your Petitioner humbly prays that your Excellency would be pleased to grant him Two Hundred Acres of the waste Lands of the Crown under the Regulations act passed 6<sup>th</sup> July 1804.
