That your Petitioner is a Native of Lower Canada
and has resided in this Province upwards of Seventeen
years. That in the year 1801 your Petitioner
obtained an order for a grant of 200 acres of land,
which from his inability to pay the Fees, has not as yet
been located. That your Petitioner is now prepared
to pay the Patent and Surveying Fees, and is desirous
of locating lot No. 26 in the 1st Concession of the Township
of Grimsborough, on which lot the name of Betty
Morden appears inserted, although she has received
her Land in a grant of 200 acres, in lot No. 21 in the 12th
Concession of the Township of Blenheim, under the
name of Betty Chrysler, daughter of John Morden
Esq.

Your Petitioner begs further to state
that he did his duty faithfully in defence of the
Province during the late War, a Certificate of which
is herewith annexed.

Wherefore your Petitioner humbly begs
that your Excellency would be pleased to grant him
permission to locate the said lot No. 26 in the 1st
Concession of Grimsborough, and your Petitioner
