I Peter Molaski of the Township of North  
Sxford in Canada West being in perfect health  
of mind and memory but weak in body and  
knowing it is given or appointed unto all men  
once to die, do make and ordain this my last will  
and testament. that is to say principally and  
first all. I give and recommend my soul into the  
hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my body  
I recommend to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian  
burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing  
doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive  
the same again by the Almighty power of God  
and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath  
pleased God to bless me in this life, I will and devise  
first that all my debts be paid and lawfull demands  
on my estate shall be discharged, after which I will  
and bequeath to Mary Rebecca my beloved Wife all my  
Lands together with all my household goods and debts  
and moveable effects, and at her death to go to my  
beloved Children as follows to my beloved son John  
five Shillings and then all my Land and all my  
other property real and personal to be equally divided  
between my beloved son Peter and my beloved Daughter  
Mary Jane, Peter to take the South half and Mary  
Jane the North

I Appoint Peter Anthony Molaski my Son and my  
friend Silas Avery Executors of this my last Will and  
Testament.

I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannull all  
and every other former Testament Will Legacy

bequests and Executors by me, in anywise by or  
made before ratifying and confirming this and  
no other to be my last will and testament  
in confirmation whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand and Seal this
