In the Name of God Amen, The twelfth day
of September in the year of our Lord one thousand
Eight Hundred and forty seven -

I Murray Nesbitt of the Township of Norwich
in the County of Oxford in the Brock District
surgeon being through the blessing of God in
a sound state of mind and memory, but calling
to mind the frail tenure of this life and that
it is appointed to all men once to die, do make
and ordain this my last will and testament
that is to say I give bequeath and dispose of it
in the manner and proportion here following
First I give and bequeath to Edward Nesbitt my
fourth son (the whole of) half of lot number
nineteen in the second concession of the Township
of Norwich in the Brock district and his heirs
executors administrators and assigns for ever
subject however the less to the following bequests
that is to say I give and bequeath to Eliza my
wife the sum of ten pounds currency ^{per annum} or less
of her own during her natural life to be paid to
her by my said son Edward - And the further
sum of four pounds currency ^{+ per annum} to be equally divided
amongst my three youngest daughters that is to say
Georgina, Margaret and Anne - until they attain the
age of twenty one years - And I give to my daughter
Elizabeth the sum of twenty five pounds currency

stock When she comes to the age of twenty one
years and her maintenance off the said property
until she is married - And I give and bequeath
to my son Murray the sum of Fifty pounds
when he attains the age of twenty one years
and the further sum of Fifty pounds in stock
provided he remains with Edward on the farm
and he is to receive one quarters schooling in
the winter months ^{each year} for the term of six years
and I further bequeath to the before named
George Margaret and Anna the sum of twenty five
pounds currency each when they arrive at the
age of twenty one years - And also I give to my
sons William and Walter to each the sum of
ten pounds currency to be paid in the year of our
Lord 1852 - And also I give to the said William
and Walter Asbitt the whole of lot No 11 in
the fifth concession in the Township of East Oxford
to be divided equally between them When the
disolve partnership - And also I give to my
John W. Asbitt my eldest son the sum of
five shillings &c - And also I leave the
whole of my disposable chattel property and
out standing debts to liquidate my present
liabilities - And also I bequeath to my dear
daughter Elenor my watch - And I request that
Edward my son will take the case of my mother
in to consideration and give her some assistance
Finally I make and appoint James Chambers

William Chambers William Edward & Robert
and John Wilson Nesbitt my executors of
this my last Will and testament and I do
hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul
all and every other former testaments wills and
executors by me in any way before named -
ratifying and confirming this and no others to
be my last Will and testament in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal the day and year first above
