Sir

I received your letter of the 29th Oct^r last and in answer to its contents therein contained I saw my Surveyor soon after my return from York, and of speaking of the improvement on Lot N^o 18. on Dundas Street, he informs me that the Man was dead, died last winter, and I since understood that the family had moved off, they were originally from the United States, and whether they have gone to their Friends I am not able to say, but however, the improvement my Surveyor told me was about 10 or 12 Acres cleared, and a house, the House is not worth anything,

However, should the same family still remain on said lot, I will make the necessary arrangements with the family, so that neither you nor Government shall have any blame on their part.

Be so good as to inform me if there is anything else wanting on this subject as I have some Idea of going up to the Township as soon as I find myself able, not having been very well for some time past.

I spoke to Colonel Smith the last time I had the pleasure of seeing him to know if I could get Lot N^o 10 in the 10th Concession 135 Acres or N^o 6. in the 11th Con^o exchanged for a lot on Dundas Street, as I was to a considerable expense in getting the Township surveyed, as I give no Lands except 200 Acres and
