LOYALIST—That *she* is *married to Jonathan Nichols* and she has never received any Land, or order for Land, from the Crown :-Wherefore, your Petitioner humbly prays, that Your Excellency in Council will be pleased to grant her TWO Hundred Acres of the Waste Lands of the Crown, and permit *Eliha Crippin* of *Cooper's* to locate the same, and take out the Deed when completed: And your Petitioner, as in duty bound, will ever pray.

E. Loyalist, who retained his loyalty during the late War, without suspicion of aiding or assisting the Enemy, and that the *do* did his duty in defence of the Province during the said War.
