Know all Men by these Presents that we, *Gilbert Storer of the Township of Norwich in the District of Brock and Province of Canada* *James Boys of Woodstock in said District and Albert G. Storer of the Township of Norwich aforesaid* are held and firmly bound to *Sir Charles J. Metcalfe* *Baronet Governor General of British North America*

of the Province of Canada, in the sum of *Twenty*

Pounds Currency, to be paid to the said *Sir Charles J. Metcalfe and his Successors*

for which payment to be well any truly made we firmly bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, and each of us severally, separately and apart from the other of us bindeth *him* self, *his* heirs, executors and administrators, firmly by these presents.

Scaled with our Seal, and dated this *Third*

Day of *August* 1843

The condition of this Obligation is such, that if the within bounden

Gilbert Storer administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of *Robert C. Nobles late of the Township of Norwich aforesaid*

deceased, to make or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular, the goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come into the hands, possession or knowledge of *him* the said *Gilbert Storer*

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for *him* and the same so made, to exhibit or cause to be exhibited in to the registry of *the Superior Court of the District of the Province* day of *February* ensuing, and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all and other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, at the time of *his* death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of the said *Gilbert Storer*

or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons, for *him* do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make or cause to be made, a true and just account of *his* said administration, at or before the *Third* day of *August 1844* and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said *administrators* accounts, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the Court, for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively, as the said Judge by his decree or sentence, conformably to the provisions in a certain Act of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for the better settling intestate Estates," and passed in the twenty-second and twentieth-third year of the reign of Charles 2d, and also in a certain Act passed in the First year of King James 2, contained, shall limit and appoint, and if it shall hereafter appear, that any last Will and Testament was made by the deceased, and the Executor or executors therein named do exhibit the same unto the said Court, making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said *Gilbert Storer*

within bounden, being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration [approbation of such testament being first had and made] in the said Court, then this Obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in full force and virtue.
